



You will see this often-overlooked Old Testament book with new eyes as we seek to learn with Elaine T. James, Associate Professor of Old Testament at Princeton Seminary. Her work focuses on the literature of the Hebrew Bible, especially its poetry, examining its significance in the ancient context and its legacy for the contemporary world. Guiding her research are questions about how artistic literary practices shape ethical and theological thought, especially around issues of land, ecology, gender and sexuality. Her book, *Landscapes the Song of Songs* (Oxford University Press, 2017) is an exploration of how the *Song of Songs* conceptualizes the natural world.

Dr. James earned her PhD and MDiv from Princeton Theological Seminary. Before joining the faculty at Princeton, Dr. James previously served as Associate Professor of Theology at St. Catherine University in St. Paul, Minnesota.

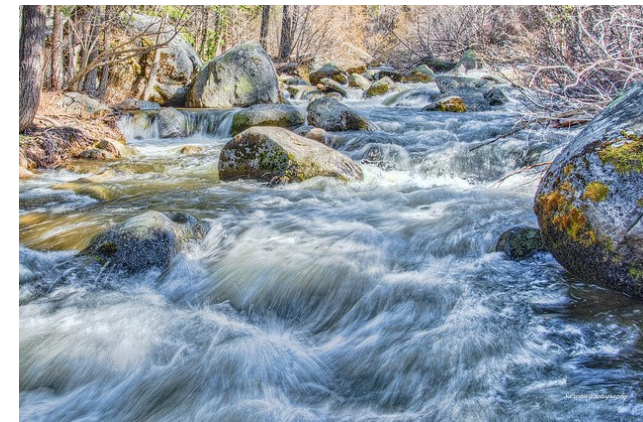
