Scottdale Mennonite Church hosted the first in-person delegate gathering since our prepandemic meeting at Hyattsville in March 2020. It was a "hybrid" session, with 14 delegates

and 12 guests attending the meeting in person and 30 guests connecting online, from 11 congregations. (This total our best approximation with the difficulty in combining person, delegate and guest totals.)

The primary agenda for the delegate meeting was to re-visit our August decision to put on hold the hiring of a Conference Minister of Children and Youth, due to uncertain financial resources and a reassessment of salary and benefits costs going forward. The Leadership Council brought some definition by recommending that we do not hire youth ministry staff during the current or subsequent fiscal years, which end June 30, 2023 and June 30, 2024. This will give AMC time to experiment with alternative ways of supporting ministry for children and youth, as we listen carefully to congregations, pastors and youth for how the next stage of such ministries might develop. We anticipate a generative time to explore a new vision for how youth ministry is configured to meet the current challenges of our congregations. A committee is coming together for this listening and discernment. Some of the former search committee members will be joined by other volunteers.

Reports from staff, our treasurer, Karin Miller, and conference representatives – including the Constituency Leaders Council and the Dismantling the Doctrine of Discovery Coalition - rounded out the event. Thank you to Scottdale Mennonite Church for your hospitality; and special thanks to Jack Scott, Dan Walter and Isaac Tice for delivering a mostly glitch free Zoom experience!

A "Celebration of Call" service was held on November 13 which affirmed the discernment of AMC's conference credentialing committee and Scottdale Mennonite Church's pastor search process to call Leah Rittenhouse into pastoral ministry. Members from both Stahl Mennonite Church, where Leah had served previously as a pastoral intern, and Scottdale Mennonite, joined to

witness the licensing, to worship, to pray and celebrate with a fellowship meal.





Joy Cotchen, former AMC Conference Minister for Children and Youth, brought the message from Ephesians 4 – "Growing Up...." Leah brings with her a wealth of experience in leading youth and young adults through her work as a Service Adventure leader under Mennonite Mission Network for three years, Summer Camp Director for Laurelville Retreat Center for the past two years, and also being a camp counselor in earlier years.

As Scottdale's half-time pastor, Leah will combine into her ministry portfolio another part-time position as Laurelville's new Youth Program Manager, where she will continue to direct the summer camping program among other duties. Allegheny welcomes Leah as our newest and youngest pastor as she and the congregation discern future ministry decisions as part of the licensing process.
